Information on Conflict Minerals

In 2010, the U.S. Congress passed the “Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act” (the “Act”), pursuant to which the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) issued rules requiring certain reporting companies to make disclosures under specific circumstances concerning the use of “Conflict Minerals”. These Conflict Minerals are defined in the “Act” as tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold which are mined in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda and Zambia. The intention of this portion of the “Act” is to further the humanitarian goal of ending the extremely violent conflict in the DRC which has been partially financed by the exploitation and trade of conflict minerals originating in the DRC and the bordering countries.

KAESER KOMPRESSOREN is not required to file reports with the SEC. Additionally, the products of **KAESER KOMPRESSOREN** are not affected by the “Act” because they are only used as a tool to produce the final product at our customers – they are not part of the final product (please refer to page 90, 91 of the “Act”):

... We do not believe that a conflict mineral in a tool or machine is captured by the Conflict Minerals Statutory Provision because, although the conflict mineral may be included in the tool or machine, additionally, the tool or machine is unlikely to be contained in the final product...

Nevertheless, we are supporting customers in the global market that are required to follow the “Act”- by diligently working to obtain the required verification on the use of conflict minerals. The complexity of our Supply Chain, as well as the Supply Chain of our Suppliers, has made this process extremely difficult. While our Suppliers have not found any indication that there are conflict minerals in the materials they supply to us yet, they are continuing to work very hard to comply with the requirements of the “Act”. This is requiring a significant investment of time and resources. Electronic components are particularly difficult due to the depth of the Supply Chain.

KAESER KOMPRESSOREN is, and has always been, committed to ensuring respect for fundamental and human rights in all we do. The same is expected and required of our Supply Chain. This philosophy is an integral part of our Corporate Policy that is stated in our QESM (Quality Environmental Health & Safety Management) Manual. SPX Flow Industrial (Ocala, FL) has not yet determined whether any products sold to Kaeser Compressors contain any of the listed minerals, gold, tin, tantalum, and tungsten, and, if so, whether any of the listed minerals are from mines controlled by any of the armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining areas. SPX Flow Industrial together with SPX Corporation, its parent company and a public company with its own conflict minerals reporting obligations, is engaged in a reasonable country of origin inquiry relating to its products, including those provided to you. We expect that it will take some time to determine the results due to the length and complexity of the supply chain for our many products. Accordingly, we currently report that it is indeterminate whether any of our products provided to you contain conflict minerals.

We are aware of the importance of complying with this reporting obligation, and will provide you with more definitive information as soon as practicable.

5. Peanuts and products thereof;
6. Soybeans and products thereof;
7. Milk and products thereof (including lactose);
8. Nuts, namely: almonds (*Amygdalus communis* L.), hazelnuts (*Corylus avellana*), walnuts (*Juglans regia*), cashews (*Anacardium occidentale*), pecan nuts (*Carya illinoensis* (Wangenh.) K. Koch), Brazil nuts (*Bertholletia excelsa*), pistachio nuts (*Pistacia vera*), macadamia or Queensland nuts (*Macadamia ternifolia*), and products thereof, except for nuts used for making alcoholic distillates including ethyl alcohol of agricultural origin;
9. Celery and products thereof;
10. Mustard and products thereof;
11. Sesame seeds and products thereof;
